Pikes Peak Regional OEM IGA

- Effective January 22, 2019
 - City of Colorado Springs Resolution 12-19
 - El Paso county Resolution 19-25
- Establishes Pikes Peak Regional Office of Emergency Management for the City and the County
- Cooperative Agency comprised of City and County staff
- Three-year term (last revised 2023)





Governance and Administration

- Joint oversight by County Administrator and City Chief of Staff
- PPROEM Director manages day-to-day operations
- Staffing from both City and County agencies
- Funding shared equitably between parties
- Receives programmatic input from the Multi-Agency Coordination Group
 - Expertise across a broad range of emergency support functions





PPROEM's EMAP Accreditation Achievement

- PPROEM achieved EMAP Accreditation in 2023
- EMAP Accreditation signifies compliance with national emergency management standards
- Demonstrates excellence in planning, preparedness, and operational capability
- Only local Office of Emergency Management accredited in Colorado
- One of 43 local programs nationally
