Leading Causes of L-Ion Fires:

- Damage
- Incompatibility
- Non-listed Charges



Additional Causes:

- Thermal Runaway
- Physical Damage
- Puncturing
- Excessive Heat
- Lack of Regulation & Safety Testing
- Manufactured to Lesser Standards



In the United States:

- Past 3 Years Average of 20 EV Fires Annually
- 25 EV Fires for Every 100,000 Sold
- 2023 Statistics
 - 445 Lithium-Ion Fires
 - 38 Deaths
 - 214 Injuries

Fire incidents, injuries, and deaths will continue to increase as more consumer devices increase and tracking of these incidents improve.





- Isolation
- Removal from Exposure(s)

HANDLING & DISPOSAL



- Place each battery or device in a separate plastic bag
- Place non-conductive tape over the battery's terminals
- Contact the battery or device manufacturer for directions
- Take them to certified recyclers or participating retailers
- Contact local solid waste or household waste collection programs
