

RESOLUTION NO. 40 - 26

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MAY 17 TO MAY 23, 2026
AS NATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS WEEK

WHEREAS, public works professionals focus on infrastructure, facilities, and services that are of vital importance to sustainable and resilient communities and the public health, high quality of life, and well-being of the people of the City of Colorado Springs; and

WHEREAS, these infrastructure, facilities, and services could not be provided without the dedicated efforts of public works professionals, who are engineers, managers, and employees at all levels of government and the private sector, who are responsible for rebuilding, improving, and protecting our City's transportation, stormwater management, street infrastructure, bridge system, public transportation, treescape, public parking, other structures and facilities essential for our citizens, and provision of our neighborhood services and code enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Colorado Springs Public Works team spent 2025 repairing over 78,000 potholes, removing over 724 cubic yards of debris from roadways, utilizing over 10,000 tons of asphalt for road repairs, installing nearly 1,300 pedestrian ramps, maintaining 720 traffic signals, pruning nearly 4,000 City-owned trees, engaging in dramatic stormwater projects to reduce flooding, closing over 17,000 cases from Neighborhood Services, providing over three million rides per Mountain Metro Transit, completing capital projects including the Circle Drive Bridges Replacement Project and Tejon Street Revitalization Project, and making tremendous progress on the Marksheffel and Road and Dublin Boulevard Improvement Projects; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the citizens, civic leaders, and children in the City of Colorado Springs to gain knowledge of and maintain an ongoing interest and understanding of the importance of public works and public works programs in their respective communities; and

WHEREAS, the year 2026 marks the 66th annual National Public Works Week sponsored by the American Public Works Association/Canadian Public Works Association.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. City Council designates the week May 17–23, 2026, as National Public Works Week and urges all citizens to join with representatives of the American Public Works Association and government agencies in activities, events, and ceremonies designed to pay tribute to our public works professionals, engineers, managers, and

employees and to recognize the substantial contributions they make to protecting our national health, safety, and advancing quality of life for all.
