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PROJECT PURPOSE

Existing corrugated metal pipes (CMP) conveying drainage in the Broadmoor Bluffs neighborhood are reaching the end of their service life.

The maintenance method of Cured In Place Pipe (CIPP) lining was selected for the following:

- Utilizes existing pipe as formwork
- Trenchless method (no digging)
- Anticipate additional 50+ years of service life
- Minimal impact to residents and traveling public

Project Goals:

- Improve public safety
- Extend infrastructure service life
- Minimize impacts to residents

NEGOTIATION HISTORY



- February 10, 2023 Notice of Intent to Acquire sent to property owners
- March 20, 2023 initial offer to property owners
- August 17, 2023 last written offer to property owners
- Earnestine Brown countered City's offer and came to a verbal agreement, but countered again at unreasonable price
- Other two owners are non-responsive

PROJECT TIMELINE



- November 2023 Begin Construction
- Construction not able to commence at these locations
 until easements acquired
- Protracted negotiations will further delay construction





- Resolution authorizes staff to utilize Possession and Use Agreement and Eminent Domain to acquire property
- Project and property acquisition funded by PPRTA
