What is a Federally Qualified Health Center?

- A Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) is a community-based health care provider that receive funds from HRSA to provide primary care services to underserved communities where economic, geographic, or cultural barriers limit access to affordable health care services.
- Health centers provide comprehensive, patient-centered primary and preventative health care to persons of all ages, regardless of income or insurance status.



Four Key Components of Health Centers

- Peak Vista Community Health Centers is the only FQHC in the Pikes Peak and East Central Regions.
- There are four key components health center must adhere to:
 - 1. Located in an area of high need
 - 2. Comprehensive set of services
 - 3. Open to everyone
 - 4. Patient-majority governing board



Health Center History: It All Began in the 1960s

Health Center Impact (National)

- \$24 billion in savings annually.
- Over **270,000** staff.
- **\$54.6 billion** in total economic activity.
- 832,000 Coloradoans served.







Health Center Impact (National)

- Since 2000, the number of patients served at health centers has nearly tripled.
- More than **30 million** people rely on a HRSA-funded health centers for care in over **14,000 communities** including:
 - 1 in 11 people
 - 1 in 5 uninsured Americans
 - 1 in 5 rural residents
 - 1 in 3 living in poverty
 - Nearly 400,000 Veterans
 - 8.6 million children
