AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 705 (COMMUNITY AMENITIES OR BENEFITS REQUIRED) OF PART 7 (PLANNED DEVELOPMENT ZONE DISTRICT) OF ARTICLE 2 (ZONE DISTRICTS) OF CHAPTER 7 (UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE) AND SECTION 1103 (MIXED-USE AND NON-RESIDENTIAL) OF PART 11 (BUILDING DESIGN AND SITE FEATURES) OF ARTICLE 4 (DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS AND INCENTIVES) OF CHAPTER 7 (UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS 2001, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO PUBLIC ART

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Section 705 (Community Amenities or Benefits Required) of Part 7 (Planned Development Zone District) of Article 2 (Zone Districts) of Chapter 7 (Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

7.2.705: COMMUNITY AMENITIES OR BENEFITS REQUIRED

* * *

B. Community Amenities: Community amenities may include the preservation of green space, sensitive natural areas, and other unique site features; the preservation or adaptive reuse of historic building; and the provision of active recreational facilities, such as parks, trails, recreation centers, community meeting rooms, and other gathering spaces that are accessible to residents of the development and the public; or ~~public~~ **works of art that are publicly accessible**

and visible to the community. ~~meets the criteria outlined in the Public Art Master Plan and as reviewed by the Public Arts Commission.~~

Section 2. Section 1103 (Mixed-Use and Non-Residential) of Part 11 (Building Design and Site Features) of Article 4 (Development Standards and Incentives) of Chapter 7 (Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

7.4.1103: MIXED-USE AND NON-RESIDENTIAL

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2. ~~Public art~~ **Artwork** may be used as a substitute for façade articulation, ~~subject to neighborhood and Public Arts Commission review.~~ **as approved by the Manager according to the following review criteria:**

- a. The artwork must have an appropriate scale and siting;**
- b. The artwork must be constructed of or installed using technically feasible materials and techniques;**
- c. The artwork must not create a safety concern for traffic or the general public; and**
- d. The artwork must be publicly accessible and visible to the community.**

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by Charter.

Section 4. Council deems it appropriate that this ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ordinance be available for inspection and acquisition in the Office of the City Clerk.
